<b>Expenditure Required (amount and source)</b>	If selected, a 20% match will be required. This is estimated at \$12,00 and could come from multiple sources.
<b>Background Information</b>	At the regular meeting on January 06, 2020, staff presented information related to an application for the Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission's Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The City is proposing to submit an application to conduct a parking inventory, analysis, and management plan that will build off the Downtown Parking Study completed in 2017. This effort will explore and evaluate the parking inventory and demand, and how changes to City facilities (Main Street Revitalization, addition of Abenaki Way Garage, etc.) will impact demand and availability of parking. The focus will be related to public parking facilities including the Cascades Garage, and parking along several corridors throughout the City. Specific outcomes will include an inventory and analysis of parking needs, guidance on expanding parking enforcement, updates to the City's Municipal Code (Chapter 15), land development updates, and other parking management initiatives.
