ARTICLE TWO: CITY BUDGET

Shall the voters of the City of Winooski approve the budget for the Fiscal year for 2021 in the amount of Seven Million, Six Hundred Twenty-Seven Thousand, One Hundred, Forty-Eight Dollars and Sixty-Two Cents (\$7,627,148.62)? The amount to be raised from property taxes is Five Million, Nine Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand, Six Hundred Thirty-Eight dollars and Four Cents (\$5,926,638.04).

ARTICLE IV: OTHER FUNDS

Shall the District accept and expend the sum of Two Million, Seven Hundred Ninety Thousand, Five Hundred Twenty-Five dollars (\$2,790,525) or whatever sum is provided by federal programs for the support of compensatory education and special programs? Said sum shall be exclusively federal funds received by the District. (No local or statewide school property taxes included in these funds.)

ARTICLE V: SCHOOL BUDGET

Shall the voters of the School District approve the school board to expend Nineteen Million, Five Thousand, Sixty-Four dollars (\$19,005,064), which is the amount the school board has determined to be necessary for the ensuing fiscal year? It is estimated that this proposed budget, if approved, will result in education spending of Fifteen Thousand, Eight Hundred Fifty-Four Dollars (\$15,854) per equalized pupil. This projected spending per equalized pupil is 4% higher than spending for the current year.
